Sam was wandering through Woolworth, a huge store in town. That was when he saw something. It was a hammer he needed. He had previously gathered at least fifty nails which workers from another store had carelessly discarded. To Sam, they were not to be wasted. Now, together with this tool, he believed he could build something, perhaps a bench, for his mother to rest on after a hard day's work.

Without much thought, Sam took the tool and slipped it into the pocket of his overalls. Just as he was about to step out of the store, a young man named Mike took him firmly by the arm and led him to the back of the store into a small office. Mr Cody, the manager of the store, was seated behind a desk. Mike, who had captured him, was excited and said, "Well, here's the third one I have caught this week!" He turned to Sam and spoke in a voice loud enough for Mr Cody to hear, "You think you can get away? Not on my watch!"

Mr Cody ordered Mike to leave the office as he would deal with the culprit himself. Being absorbed in his own work and annoyed at the thought of having to deal with yet another one caught red-handed. Mr Cody ignored Sam, who stood there for a while. After some time, Sam became impatient. He spoke, "I didn't mean to take the hammer. I just wanted to borrow it to build a bench for my mother. I haven't got any money."

Mr Cody finally looked at Sam. "Just because you haven't got any money doesn't mean it's right to take things without paying!" Mr Cody yelled. He pointed an accusing finger at Sam and hissed, "You are nothing but a thief!" Upon hearing those words, Sam's heart sank. The words cut him like a knife. Sam felt utterly humiliated but kept mum. Mr Cody made Sam promise never to steal from the store again and told him not to return until he had the money to pay for the tool.

Sam walked out of the office feeling defeated. When he recounted what had happened to his mother, she reprimanded him for stealing. "We may be poor, but we are certainly not thieves! I thought you were better than this," his mother said, sounding disappointed. Feeling guilty, Sam apologised and promised not to do it again. He realised that there were better ways to get what he wanted. Even though his mother offered to buy him a hammer, he declined it. That night, Sam was consumed by thoughts of how he could correct his mistake. He decided that he needed to right his wrong at the place where it all started.

The next evening, Sam's mother returned home from work and noticed Sam constructing 30 a bench with a hammer. When asked by his mother, Sam explained, "I worked all day at Mr Cody's store. I earned the tool after an hour, but I continued working." Sam's mother nodded approvingly and smiled. That purged the guilt he felt for resorting to steal. A sense of satisfaction overwhelmed Sam as he had proven Mr Cody wrong. He was determined to do things the right way from then on.
